Biographies:

Karen Finerman, is the co-founder and co-portfolio manager of Metropolitan Capital, a hedge fund, founded in 1992 which specializes in event-driven investing with approximately \$400 million under management. Her responsibilities include investment selection, hedging strategies, and managing a team of 11 professionals. Prior to forming Metropolitan Capital, she was director of risk arbitrage research at Donaldson, Lufkin, and Jenrette. She graduated from the Wharton School at the University of Pennsylvania with a B.S. in Economics in 1987.

Ms Finerman is the Chairwoman of the development committee of the Michael J. Fox Foundation and a Trustee of the Montefiore Medical Center in the Bronx, N.Y.

Patricia M. Gammon, CFA, directs marketing and investor relations for Bass Multiple Strategy Funds. Prior to joining the Bass organization in 1999, Ms. Gammon was Vice President at The Blackstone Group, where she shared responsibility for investment management of Blackstone Alternative Asset Management, a fund of funds. Before joining Blackstone in 1995, Ms. Gammon was Director of Investments-Capital Markets Group at Yale University for 17 years. Ms. Gammon is a graduate of the University of Pennsylvania.

Liz Hilpman joined Barlow Partners on January 1, 2001 as a partner of the firm. She and George Hambrecht are responsible for the selection and monitoring of all investments.

During her career, Ms. Hilpman has been at the forefront of investing in alternative investment strategies. For nine years she was at Commonfund serving in the final years as Vice President, Investments with co-responsibility for hedge fund investments. It was in this capacity when Barlow Partners was a manager for Commonfund that Mr. Hambrecht and Ms. Hilpman first met. In 1994, Ms. Hilpman joined Dubin & Swieca as Director of Alternative Manager Research. Subsequently, she returned to the endowment community as an Investment Officer at Dartmouth College.

Following Dartmouth, Ms. Hilpman joined Global Asset Management in 1998 as an Investment Manager with responsibility for the U.S. component of GAM's Diversity Fund, a \$1.1 billion fund-of-funds. She also had responsibility for the management of a \$250 million multi-strategy U.S. fund-of-funds as well as GAM's \$50 million technology fund-of-funds.

Ms. Hilpman graduated with a B.A. from the University of New Hampshire. She is a frequent speaker at hedge fund conferences on the subjects of asset allocation, manager selection, and monitoring. Ms.

Hilpman has been published in Investment Policy as part of their series on the Anatomy of Alternative Investing.

Amy L. Robbins is a Partner at Glenview Capital Management, and joined Glenview Capital at inception as Co-Founder and Chief Operating Officer. Prior to joining Glenview, Ms. Robbins spent seven years with First Chicago/Bank One as an Associate and then Vice President in the commercial lending and structured transaction groups. Ms. Robbins performed a variety of underwriting and credit management functions within the bank in their Chicago, New York and Hong Kong offices. Ms. Robbins holds a Bachelor of Arts degree from the University of Wisconsin-Madison with majors in Finance and French. Ms. Robbins is a member of the Board of Directors of the JCC in Manhattan and serves on the Executive, Finance and Nursery School Committees. Ms. Robbins also serves on the Board of Directors of KIPP Academy as Secretary, and serves on the Audit & Finance Committee. Ms. Robbins is actively involved with the Robin Hood Foundation, the US Fund for UNICEF and the Acumen Fund. Ms. Robbins lives in Manhattan with her husband Larry and their four sons.
