Exposure to toxic chemicals is a topic that is rising to the top of many political, medical, and business conversations. It is reported that there is the potential to be exposed to 80,000 chemicals in our food, personal care, clothing and electronics on a daily basis. Only a handful have been evaluated for their effect on human health and new evidence suggests a direct correlation between chemical exposure during prenatal and early childhood and the rapid rise of chronic illness in this country and around the world. Public concern is growing and already creating market tremors in both consumer goods and the network of supply chains associated with them.

Andy Baynes, Head of Environmental Technologies, Apple Computer

Andy Baynes, Head of Environmental Technologies Team, Apple Computer. Mr. Baynes is responsible for Apple's programs on hazardous materials use reduction, energy efficiency, climate change, new material integration and global regulatory compliance covering Mac, iPod and iPhone divisions. Prior to joining Apple in 2001, Mr. Baynes was with Sony International's Advanced Technology Centre, Stuttgart, Germany. He holds a Masters degree in Environmental Technologies from Imperial College, London.

John Burbank III, Founder and Chief Investment Officer, Passport Capital

John Burbank, III, Founder and Chief Investment Officer, Passport Capital, LLC, a San Francisco-based, global hedge fund. The firm manages approximately \$3.2 billion in assets. The investment team focuses on the following industry sectors: Metals/Mining, Energy, India, Internet/Technology, Global Consumer, Healthcare/Biotechnology and Sub-Prime Mortgage CDS.

Mr. Burbank has over a decade of experience investing in global equity markets. Prior to founding the firm in 2000, he was a consultant to JMG Triton Offshore, Ltd. From 1996 to 1998, Mr. Burbank was director of research at ValueVest Management. He holds a B.A. degree from Duke University and earned an M.B.A. degree from the Stanford Business School.

In 2007, Mr. Burbank established Passport Foundation, a grant making philanthropy that supports organizations that increase understanding of the impacts on human health of environmental contaminants, and advocate for policy changes that protect public health.

Gary Cohen, Founder and Co-Executive Director, Health Care without Harm

Gary Cohen is a founder and Co-Executive Director of Health Care without Harm (www.noharm.org), the international campaign for environmentally responsible healthcare. HCWH is working to prevent disease and illness in society by assisting the healthcare sector in understanding the links between a healthy environment and healthy people and helping hospitals become more environmentally sustainable while saving money.

HCWH has over 500 member organizations and partners in 50 countries, with offices in Washington, D.C., Brussels, Buenos Aires and Manilla.

Cohen is a co-founder of Green Harvest Technologies, a bio-based green chemistry company, working to replace toxic products with safer alternatives. Mr. Cohen was awarded the Skoll Global Award for Social Entrepreneurship in 2006 and the Frank Hatch Award for Enlightened Public Service Award in 2007.

Dr. Philip Landrigan, M.Sc., the Ethel Wise Professor and Chair of the Department of Preventive Medicine, Mt. Sinai Hospital

Dr. Phil Landrigan, M.Sc., the Ethel Wise Professor and Chair of the Department of Preventive Medicine, Mt. Sinai Hospital. Dr. Landrigan is a pediatrician, epidemiologist, and internationally recognized leader in public health and preventive medicine. He has been a member of the faculty of Mount Sinai School of Medicine since 1985 and Chair of the Department of Preventive Medicine since 1990. Dr. Landrigan is also the Director of the Children's Environmental Health Center.

Dr. Landrigan's reputation rests largely on his role as a credible evidence-based advocate for public health, specifically in his focus on reducing the level of children's exposure to lead and pesticides, and for his participation in the World Health Organization's global campaign to eradicate smallpox. He was a central figure in developing the National Children's Study and in the medical and epidemiological studies that followed the

destruction of the World Trade Center on September 11, 2001.

From 1995 to 1997, Landrigan served on the Presidential Advisory Committee on Gulf War Veteran's Illnesses, and, in 1997 and 1998, as Senior Advisor on Children's Health to the Administrator of the U.S. Environmental Protection Agency, where he helped establish the Office of Children's Health Protection. A graduate of Harvard Medical School in 1967, he completed an internship in pediatrics/medicine at Cleveland Metropolitan General Hospital, and a residency in pediatrics at Children's Hospital Boston.

In 1977, he received a Diploma of Industrial Health from the University of London and a Masters of Science in Occupational Medicine degree from the London School of Hygiene and Tropical Medicine.

Dr. Ronald H. Hart, Chair, Science and Technology Board, SAIL Venture Partners

Dr. Ronald W. Hart, Chair, Science and Technology Board, SAIL Venture Partners. Dr. Hart, who identified the pivotal role of DNA damage in cancer and aging, is an internationally recognized scientist, scholar and expert in business acceleration strategies for emerging growth companies. He is the former Chief Scientist and Executive Director of the FDA's National Center for Toxicology Research and was the first person in the history of the FDA to be named "distinguished scientist in residence." In addition, he was a co-author of the Federal Technology Transfer Act of 1986 and co-chair of the Interdepartmental Committee on Technology Transfer for the United States government.

Dr. Hart has received over two dozen national and international awards and recognitions for his managerial and scientific contributions, including the Karl August Forester Preis from the German Academy of Science and Literature, and the Bose Medal from the Bose Institute of India. In policy development, Dr. Hart has chaired the White House Committee on Formaldehyde, the Inter-Agency Committee on Environmental Health and Related Issues, the White House Task Force on Agent Orange and the White House committee on Chemical Carcinogenesis, among others.

In addition to chairing the Science and Technology Board of SAIL Venture Partners, Dr. Hart serves independently as director or strategic advisor to numerous public and private companies, including: Guided Therapeutics, SNTech, Neogenix, St. Renuis, Ice Energy, Motor Excellence, Aerofarms and Therapy Solutions. Previously he has served on the boards of Telescan, First Commercial Bank, Wireless Services and others.

Dr. Hart received his Ph.D. in physiology and biophysics from the University of Illinois in 1971.
