Steve Algert, Managing Director, The J. Paul Getty Trust

Steve Algert is a Managing Director in the Investments Department, responsible for the hedge fund and credit-related programs of the \$5.5 billion Getty Trust. Prior to joining the Getty, Steve was at the Treasurer's Office of The Regents of the University of California, where he made the University's first hedge fund investments. He also helped oversee \$30 billion in public equities managed externally. Prior to this, Steve was in the fund of hedge funds group at Citigroup Alternative Investments, in fixed income research at BARRA RogersCasey, and in the fixed income risk management group at BARRA. Steve holds a Masters in Public and Private Management from the Yale School of Management and a B.S. from the University of California at Berkeley. He is a CFA and CAIA charter holder.

Tom Lopez, Chief Investment Officer, Los Angeles Fire & Police Pension Systems

Tom Lopez is the Chief Investment Officer of Los Angeles Fire & Police Pensions. He has worked at the Los

Angeles Fire & Police Pension System in the investment section for over 32 years. He has been the Chief

Investment Officer of the system since 1993. The Los Angeles Fire & Police Pension System operates a defined

benefit pension plan covering all firefighters and police officers of the City of Los Angeles. In addition to service

retirements, the Plan also provides survivor benefits to the families of those killed on duty and disability retirements

to those severely injured and unable to continue their Department careers. The plan is approximately \$15.5 billion

and has over 13,000 active members and over 12,000 retired.

Lisa Mazzocco, Chief Investment Officer, University of Southern California

Lisa Mazzocco was named USC's first chief investment officer effective April 18, 2011. Reporting directly to the president and working closely with the university's chief financial officer and the investment committee of the USC Board of Trustees, Mazzocco is charged with building a staff that will bolster the investment function of USC's endowment in support of the university's academic aspirations. She also advises the investment and finance committees of the USC Board of Trustees with respect to endowment performance, and chairs the university's retirement oversight committee. Before joining USC, Mazzocco was chief investment officer for the Los Angeles County Employees Retirement Association (LACERA), where she had worked since 1992. At LACERA, she was responsible for asset allocation of a \$31 billion pension fund, working with the association's Board of Investments to develop implementation plans for its investment strategies. She previously served as a senior analyst at Security Pacific National Bank, and began her career at Wilshire Associates. Mazzocco holds an MBA from California State Polytechnic University, Pomona, and a bachelor's degree from San Diego State University.
