#### **Biographies**

John Miller, artist and Professor of Professional Practice in Art History, Columbia University An artist and critic, John Miller has exhibited his work internationally since the early 1970s. Both his artistic output and criticism typically concern the role of aesthetics within mass culture. One-person shows include the Center for Contemporary Art, Tokyo; Kunstverein, Hamburg; DAAD Galerie, Berlin; PS1, New York; and Magasin-Centre National d'Art Contemporain, Grenoble, France. Miller is a Professor of Professional Practice in Art History at Columbia University and has been the recipient of numerous awards and honors including the Louis Comfort Tiffany Award, the Wolfgang Hahn Prize, and a Pollock Krasner Foundation grant. An anthology of Miller's writings, The Ruin of Exchange (Positions), was recently published by JRP-Ringier.

### Marc Jancou, Marc Jancou Contemporary

Marc Jancou has promoted numerous contemporary art projects since opening his first gallery in Zürich in 1993, Galerie Marc Jancou. In 1996 he founded London Projects in London, exhibiting work by Martin Kippenberger, Cindy Sherman, and Chris Burden, among many others. London Projects collaborated on many ventures with the Tate Gallery, London, including Rites of Passage, Art for the End of the Century, curated by Frances Morris. In 1997 he opened Marc Jancou Contemporary in New York, focusing on emerging and mid-career artists. The gallery has presented the inaugural New York exhibitions for numerous international artists. Jancou opened in Geneva in 2011 in the heart of the city's art community, the Quartier des Bains, and aims to foster a trans-Atlantic creative dialogue and to serve as a cultural bridge between New York and Geneva.
