**Ellen van der Gulik**, Senior Portfolio Manager and Strategist, Moore Capital

Ellen van der Gulik is a senior portfolio manager and strategist at Moore Capital. Ellen has a central role in developing the key macro views for the firm's principal risk taker. She helps translate these views into profitable trading strategies, particularly in the FX and Fixed Income space, and is personally responsible for the management of some of these trading positions. Ellen joined Moore Capital in January 2002, taking up the role of Director of Research, which she held for five years. Before joining Moore Capital, Ellen worked at JPMorgan for eight years, initially as the Euro area economist, writing for the Global Data Watch publication, and later as fixed income strategist. Ellen started her career as an Economist at the Bank of England in 1990. She holds a Masters' degree in Applied Econometrics from the University of Amsterdam and a MSc in Economics from the London School of Economics.

**Samantha Huggins**, Head of US Client Sales Trading, Citi

Samantha Huggins is a Managing Director in Equity Sales Trading responsible for the US account base into EMEA Equities Execution. Outside of her immediate business responsibilities, Samantha sits on the Steering Committee for Citi Women in Markets as well as the Markets Recruiting Committee. She joined Citi London in 2009 and prior to that was with Merrill Lynch in both their London and New York offices. Samantha holds a Bachelor degree from Georgetown University.

**Amanda Pullinger**, Chief Executive Officer, 100 Women in Hedge Funds

Ms. Pullinger is the Chief Executive Officer of 100 Women in Hedge Funds. She was promoted to this position on Jan 1, 2014. Previously, she consulted as Executive Director for six years. She leads a small staff team and manages over 300 volunteer practitioners globally, overseeing the operations of the organization, which now has over 12,000 members in 17 locations.

Ms. Pullinger is a former principal of Aquamarine Capital Management, where she was responsible, over a period of seven years, for managing marketing, investor relations and back office administration for two private investment funds.

Ms. Pullinger is currently on the Boards of two British charities - she is Chairman of the Board of The HALO Trust ([www.halotrust.org](http://www.halotrust.org)) and is on the Board of Trustees of SkillForce ([www.skillforce.org](http://www.skillforce.org)) and serves on the Advisory Board of the Oxford Alumni Association of NY. She previously served on the Boards of the NYU Cancer Institute and Girls' Prep, and was on the founding Board of 100 Women in Hedge Funds, serving as its President for two years. She is a member of the British Academy of Film and Television Arts (BAFTA) and a Fellow of the Royal Society of Arts.

Ms. Pullinger graduated from Brasenose College, Oxford University in 1987 with an Honours Degree in Modern History. She earned an MBA from La Salle University, Philadelphia, in 1998, and received the Academic Award for MBA student of the year as well as the Beta Gamma Sigma designation.

**Nimisha Srivastava**, Senior Investment Consultant, Credit Specialist, Towers Watson

Nimisha Srivastava, CAIA is a senior member of the 45-person credit research team at Towers Watson, leading structured credit manager research and client credit portfolio construction efforts. She is also specifically responsible for linking research across both liquid and illiquid credit at the firm, spanning multi-strategy, long/short credit, securitised/structured credit, emerging markets debt, and illiquid credit including distressed, direct lending, etc. Prior to joining Towers Watson in 2014, Nimisha was one of two members managing the credit portfolio for the Universities Superannuation Scheme, the largest pension scheme in the UK. Before USS, she was a senior member of the hedge fund research team at Segal Rogercasey, a U.S. investment consultant focused on Taft-Hartley, Public and Corporate pension plans. She began her career at Deutsche Bank in Sales & Trading, working across hedge funds/structured products sales and advising institutional clients on their hedge fund portfolio allocations. She has also worked with the KAUST endowment (King Abdullah University of Science & Technology), helping to launch their hedge fund portfolio and was selected as a 100 Women in Hedge Funds/CAIA Scholar in 2012. Nimisha graduated with honours from Carnegie Mellon University with a B.S. in Mathematical Sciences and holds an MBA from the MIT Sloan School of Management.
