Biography

Iris Bohnet, Professor of Public Policy and Director of its Women and Public Policy Program, Kennedy School of Government, Harvard University

Iris Bohnet is Professor of Public Policy at the Harvard Kennedy School and the director of its Women and Public Policy Program. She is also the co-chair of the Behavioral Insights Group (BIG) at the Center for Public Leadership at HKS, an associate director of the Harvard Decision Science Laboratory, and the faculty chair of the executive program "Global Leadership and Public Policy for the 21st Century" for the World Economic Forum's Young Global Leaders. From 2011 to 2014, she served as the Kennedy School's Academic Dean. Currently, she serves on the boards of directors of Credit Suisse and University of Lucerne, as well as the advisory boards of the Vienna University of Economics and Business, EDGE, and numerous academic journals. She is a member of the Global Agenda Council on Behavior of the World Economic Forum. A Swiss citizen, she received her Ph.D. in Economics from the University of Zurich in 1997 and spent a year as a research fellow at the Haas School of Business at the University of California Berkeley from 1997-1998. She joined the Harvard Kennedy School as an assistant professor in 1998 and was made full professor in 2006. She is married to Michael Zurcher, and she and her husband have two children. An expert on behavioural economics and gender, her book WHAT WORKS: Gender Equality By Design is forthcoming in March 2016.
