Yodia T. Lo is a member of the Alternatives Team at Church Commissioners (or Church Commissioners for England). At the £7 billion endowment arm of the Church of England Yodia focuses on co-investments, credit strategies and hedge funds. Prior to her employment with the Church in 2015 she was head of Multi-Strat and Event Driven manager selection at Towers Watson. Emily is Head of Strategy Implementation within the Strategy Coordination group at USS. She heads a team investing into hedge funds, liquid long only products and managing Treasury functions. Prior to rejoining USS in 2015 after a stint at Bfinance, she was at Asset Alliance, ABM AMRO and Key Asset Management.

Sandra Robertson, Chief Investment Officer and Chief Executive Officer, Oxford Endowment 100WHF European Industry Leadership Award 2012 Honouree

Sandra is Chief Investment Officer, Chief Executive Officer and sits on the Board of OUem. As Chief Investment Officer, Sandra has discretion for all investment decisions. As Chief Executive Officer, she is responsible for overall strategy of the business and ensuring the success of the company. Prior to joining OUem at its inception in September 2007, Sandra spent 14 years at the Wellcome Trust, most recently as Co-Head of Portfolio Management, sitting on its investment committee from 1997-2007. Sandra is a Trustee of The Queen's Trust, a member of the Wolfson Foundation Investment Committee and sits on the TIFF Advisory Board in the US.

Peter McGleughlin, Managing Director, Barclays

Peter McGleughlin is a Managing Director in the Senior Relationship Management (SRM) team at Barclays. Kathryn Graham, Head of Strategy Coordination, USS, 100WHF London Board Chair

Ms Graham is Head of Strategy Coordination at Universities Superannuation Scheme Ltd (USS), which operates one of the largest pension schemes in the UK, with total fund assets of over £40 billion. In this role she is in charge of asset allocation and portfolio construction as well as the active risk budgeting process. In addition she oversees external manager selection for public mandates and liability hedging.

She is a former Director and Head of Special Projects at BT Pension Scheme Management Limited (BTPSM), the pensions advisory arm of the BT Pension Scheme, one of the largest in the UK. Ms Graham spent nine years at BTPSM establishing a new team mandated to invest directly into single manager hedge funds before taking responsibility for Manager Selection across the BT Scheme. Latterly she worked for the BTPSM CEO, establishing the liability team and undertaking various projects related to scheme strategy.

Ms Graham's career began at SG Warburg in 1994 in fixed income derivatives and she has also worked at UBS and Progressive Alternative Investments before joining BTPSM. Ms Graham was educated at Edinburgh University and holds an MA in Economics and Mathematics.

Ms Graham is a Trustee of the Hedge Fund Standards Board and Chair of the London Board of 100 Women in Hedge Funds. She received Hedge Funds Review's outstanding contribution to the industry by an institutional investor award in 2011.
