Elodie Morel, Head of Photographic Department, Christie's

Elodie Morel joined Christie's Photographs department in 2005 after 14 years contemporary art market experience. One of her first successes was the discovery of unique Man Ray's rayographs in 2007. She was part of the team who opened the Photographic department in Paris in 2010. There followed many successes in significant art sales: Richard Avedon Foundation's collection, in 2011, the sale of the collection of Henri-Cartier Bresson, whose Derrière la Gare Saint-Lazare received a record valuation. Photographs by Irving Penn from a private collection, and in 2012, and the sale of Primat de la Matière sur la Pensée by Man Ray. As Head of the Sales from May 2014, more recently she was involved in the discovery of unrevealed daguerreotypes from Joseph-Philibert Girault de Prangey sold in Paris in November 2015. She was appointed Head of the department in September 2015.
