MASTER OF CEREMONIES – LYNN SWANN

Lynn Swann, consensus All-American from the University of Southern California, was selected as the number one draft choice of the Pittsburgh Steelers in 1974. That began a nine-year career that included four Super Bowl wins, selection to All-rookie Team in 1974, Pro Bowls in 1976, 1978, and 1979, MVP of Super Bowl X, and NFL Man of the Year in 1981. In 2001, Lynn was elected to the Pro-Football Hall of Fame. He began his broadcasting career in 1976 while still active as a professional player.

In 1981, in association with the Pittsburgh Ballet Theatre, he created a fund that has provided more 100 scholarships to the Pittsburgh Ballet Theatre School for children. He was the national spokesperson for Project H.O.P.E.+E, an organization that teaches entrepreneurial skills to fifth and sixth graders. In 2002, President Bush selected Lynn to chair the President's Council on Physical Fitness and Sports.

Lynn's relationship with Big Brothers Big Sisters began when a friend invited him to a Big Brothers Big Sisters national convention. He had always been interested in programs that nurture and create opportunities for children. He was asked to be national spokesperson in 1980. Lynn has spoken to many local chapters, served as an advocate, testified before congress, and visited the White House on behalf of BBBS.

BIGS AND LITTLES CHORUS

The Bigs and Littles Chorus (BLC) was created as part of the BBBS of New York City Centennial Celebration CD Project. The project was conceived, produced, written and arranged by John Danny Madden, a Big Brother. Mr. Madden along with his wife, Victoria Bell, founded The Chorus, which is made up of Bigs and Littles of diverse ages and nationality. They perform from a variety of musical styles including Gospel, Broadway, R&B, and Folk. The CD is used for community outreach, recruitment, and as a fundraising tool.

The BLC is a permanent part of Big Brothers Big Sisters of New York City and is open to all Bigs and Littles. The money raised from performance fees is used for a college scholarship fund for its members. Through the impact of music, the BLC believes that people can be empowered and unified to create a positive effect throughout the world.
