She also serves on the Board of Directors for many well-respected organizations and was named one of the "50 Women in Hedge Funds," published by *The Hedge Fund Journal* and Ernst & Young, in 2013, 2010 and 2009. Ms. Buchan is also a 100WHF Charter Angel, one of the senior members whose vision and generosity supported the initial founding of 100WHF and its operations.
