

100 Women in Hedge Funds Raises More Than £500,000 for SkillForce at London Gala and Other Fundraising Events

The 100WHF London Gala was held yesterday evening at Middle Temple Hall in London, with the support of more than 200 leaders from the alternative investment industry. Alexandra Jung, Partner and Co-Head of European Investments at Oak Hill Advisors L.P., received 100 WHF's 2016 European Industry Leadership Award in recognition of her example and advocacy of mentorship for future leaders of the industry.

100WHF was honoured to host HRH The Duke of Cambridge, Royal Patron of SkillForce and of 100WHF's philanthropic initiatives as detailed in The Duke of Cambridge's letter. 100WHF's partnership with The Charities Forum of The Duke and Duchess of Cambridge and Prince Harry focuses on a selected charity each year and reflects 100WHF's three philanthropic themes of mentoring, women's and family health, and education. This year's 100WHF global theme is mentoring.

The SkillForce Character Award programme has just started this academic year as a pilot and involves 1,013 children and young people, aged five to 14, in 37 primary and secondary schools across England, Scotland and Wales. HRH The Duke of Cambridge has lent his support to the programme, which comprises practical activities that develop character including resilience, compassion, courage, teamwork and problem solving skills. The scheme

draws on the skills, knowledge and expertise of SkillForce instructors, 70% of whom are ex-Service personnel and is supported by the investment company Standard Life.
